Background and Context

Football South Australia is the governing body for football in South Australia. We are a large member-based organisation with an official participant base of in excess of 40,000 players across 14 associations, with over 300 clubs statewide.

Football SA is responsible for high performance programs for talented athletes, competition management, the management and performance of ServiceFM Stadium, governance, financial management and strategy for the game in the state.

Purpose of Role

The State Futsal Lead is responsible for the leadership, coordination, and delivery of futsal development programs across South Australia. This role oversees futsal development pathways, state programs, championships, coach education, and growth initiatives, while acting as the primary liaison with Football Australia on futsal related matters. The role plays a critical part in growing futsal participation, strengthening the talent pipeline, and ensuring alignment with national frameworks.

Key Areas of Responsibility

Futsal Development & Pathways

- Oversee the planning, administration, and delivery of Futsal Development Centres, including:
 - Session design and curriculum alignment
 - Session delivery and staffing
 - Marketing, promotion, and participant recruitment
 - Registration and data management
- Contribute to the ongoing review and refinement of futsal pathways in alignment with Football SA and Football Australia priorities.

State Futsal Program

- Lead the Football SA State Futsal Program, including:
 - Trial coordination and player identification
 - Team selection processes

- Coach appointment and support
- Leadership of state teams and attendance at national tournaments.

Events & Competitions

- Organise and deliver the Football SA State Futsal Championships, in collaboration with Football SA Competitions staff.
- Liaise with FSA Game Development staff to run a School Futsal Gala Day.
- Coordinate logistics, staffing, scheduling, and operational delivery to ensure high-quality events.

Coach Education

- Organise and support Futsal Coach Education initiatives, in collaboration with:
 - Football SA Coach Education Team
 - Football Australia Coach Education staff
- Support the development of futsal-specific coaches across the state.

National & Stakeholder Engagement

- Act as the primary Football Australia contact for futsal in South Australia, including:
 - Conference calls and national meetings
 - Interstate travel as required
- Build strong relationships with internal and external stakeholders, clubs, coaches, and partners.
- Any other duties as required.
